Understanding Sacred Sites (Wahi Pana)

Basic protocols

**Cultural Significance** 

Preservation

Remove sunglasses when addressing cultural sites

✓ Speak quietly near waterfalls

✓ Waterfalls: Sacred boundaries between realms

Freshwater (wai): Source of life

Stay on marked trails

Pack out all trash

 $\checkmark$  Ask permission before entering

- Leave natural elements undisturbed
- Vo stacking rocks or building cairns

## Hawaiian Terms & Meanings

- Wahi Pana: Sacred place
- ✓ Mālama 'Āina: Care for the land
- 🗸 Kapu: Sacred, forbidden
- Mauka: Mountain side
- ✓ Makai: Ocean side
- ✓ Wai: Freshwater
- 🧹 'Āina: Land

- ✓ Native plants: Traditional gathering areas
- Ancient walls/structures: Archaeological sites
- ✓ Pools: Traditional gathering places

## **Respectful Practices**

- Ask permission before gathering
- ✓ Never remove rocks/plants
- ✓ Avoid loud behavior
- ✓ Follow posted signs
- Support local stewards
- Learn sites' names/history

- ✓ No graffiti/marking
- Report damage
- Support conservation efforts
